A BULLETIN IS BORN!

On Thanksgiving weekend of 1975, libertarian socialists met in New York and decided to launch a discussion bulletin based around the already existing, though informal, network of activists on the east coast. An agreement was made to work towards an east coast conference of anti-authoritarian socialists. This bulletin exists to organize that conference.

Those who attended the meeting shared a distrust of those anarchist and Leninist-inspired movements which indulge in abstractions or see themselves as vanguards. We cannot work with people who lack a libertarian socialist analysis and who have no base in the working class struggle.

Our general understanding of libertarian socialism is this: the sharing, refining, planning and distributing of the world's resources in such a way that cooperation replaces competition and decentralization replaces rule from above. People seeking such a world must be opposed to coercion and those institutions which divide the working class. Their struggle must be against capitalism and the bureaucratic collectivist state.

Through studying with, talking to and acting in harmony with our comrades around the world we can arrive at a better definition. We are not leaders of, but a tendency within, a world wide class struggle. We need help. Will you join?

INTRODUCTION

We have noted with some enthusiasm the growth of the libertarian socialist movement in recent years. We know of at least thirty groups around the world actively propagating the cause of the working class and defending the prisoners taken in this great struggle. This good work is no longer just the result of occaisional efforts of college students or people outside of the producing class, but is the result of working people combining into non-hierarchical organizations for their defense and in their class interests.

With every movement comes charlatans, provocateurs and misguided souls seeking to distract or pervert the struggle for human emancipation. It is with some sadness that we say that all too many anarchist organizations and groupuscules have fallen under the influence of such people. We hope that our comrades will soon see their way clear of such misleaders and will get on with the good and neccessary work to be done.

We have hopes of joining with comrades on the east coast in order that we may form a federation to provide direction and aid to the class struggle. Currently we have any number of people printing leaflets and texts aimed at the working person, but we are scattered and there is precious little sharing of information or implementing of mutual aid and assitance programs.

In some cases, of course, the divisions between certain groups is warranted. In publicizing our efforts we encountered many people making bad use of the label "anarcho-communist" and we have been excluded from efforts to form an anarchist federation here in New York. But, for the most part, there is much in common between comrades in Boston, Rhode Island, New York and Philadelphia. We seek unity and clarity and we recognize that these are but the products of a broad based, though formal and defined, political association of libertarian socialists.

ANARCHO-FEMINIST NOTES

When I speak of freedom, I think of a smile which would extend for miles and a tear that would be shared by all, of an embrace which wouldn't leave you empty and of a question that would patiently wait for a response. Waiting is not so difficult when love is involved.

However, how can we all simultaneously smile, cry, embrace and love if one person's joy is at the expense of another's sorrow? When power and status are placed in a vertical hierarchy, it becomes inevitable that those below us will suffer from our advancement and those above us will rejoice in our failure. Because those individuals on our level become threats to our stability, we are forced to compete. Competition makes us distrustful, frightened and leaves us feeling very incompetent and insecure. Consequently, Darwin will be proved correct and the "fittest" will survive.

Yet...who is the fittest? Is it the capitalist who continues to exploit the workers? Is it the "successful" millionaire who has gained his/her wealth through the anniliation of souls? Is it the sex-symbol who wins the hearts of men while tearing apart the hearts of her sisters? Who is the fittest? And the fittest for what?

Anarchism is based on the belief that individuals function best when there is no room for vertical hierarchies, so that men and women can work collectively and taste the joy of their labor.

Anarchism stresses the importance of the individual, so that one's activities and desires are based on his/her needs and not upon the obscurity labeled "society".

Feminism means more than the "stylish" activity of joining women's organizations. It means more then being an independent financial success. How much of a feminist is the woman who denounces male supremacy, only to aid in the exploitation of her sisters? How much of a feminist is the woman who pleads for freedom while accepting a new doctrine explaining which forms of behavior are acceptable to the newly "liberated" female?

The people of West Virginia have had it with strip mining. Councils and protest organizations have been organized to stop the exploitation of the Appalachian mountains and people. PROGRESS REPORT

AMP would be good to use, but is located in West Virginia. BMP has yet to answer. We can possibly use a radical print shop on Long Island or go to a commercial place. In any event, we estimate the following expenses:

Postage: 25 "
Supplies: 30 "

This does not include money for new literature. Money coming in for literature is being turned over to the group. We would like to keep a fresh supply of literature on hand to sell. I wrote to Mother Earth Books and offered to exchange some items with them. They have yet to answer.

Appeals have been sent to SRAF, Freedom and Black Star. Synthesis has also received word of our activities. I'd like to put a note on Winbut do not have the money.

I've also written to IWW contacts in Maine and Pennsylvania. Philadepphia Solidarity has also been contacted.

People should try and give us some idea of how many copies they can distribute. We need help in financing, layout and keeping literature stocked.

As of this writing we have \$9.25 on hand. As I have just been laid off I cannot contribute as I had expected.

The first issue will probably contain the attached introductory statement, a column of union news, an article on anarcha-feminism, a literature list and a directory.

Franco was unable to put an end to the anti-fascist forces within Spain. Despite his efforts to show the world a Spain free of strife and turmoil, the democratic and revolutionary forces (both within Spain and without) would not let the Spanish people be compromised and sold.

When that dictator died, attended by his priests and doctors, the class conscious and militant sections of the international working class movements sighed with relief. The question was: what now?

Just as in the 1930's, Spain is torn between reaction and revolution, between socialism and barbarism. Who are the friends of Spanish freedom? Who are the most militant sections in the struggle for self-determination?

The anarchists.

We did not disappear in 1939. Our collectives went underground, our cooperatives and factories closed and the land was covered with our blood, but the anarchists kept fighting. The Confederacion Nacional del Trabajo (CNT) still continues to function. Other anarchist organization were founded or continued, many taking up arms against the regime. They were a danger to Franco. They are now a threat to Juan Carlos.

We have opposed totalitarianism, whether it marches in the black shirts of the fascists or behind the red banners of "communism" and "social democracy". The anarchists believe in direct worker control of industry, the socializing of all wealth, the destruction of the state and the redistribution of power and wealth to the point that might no longer determines right.

In Sabadell (in Catalonia) the CNT recently organized a general strike. The whole district of Llobergat is behind the CNT, having given its support to that revolutionary union. They have dared to struggle. With our support they will win.
